More people die from suicide each year than in car accidents, and people living in rural and remote areas are in the high suicide risk category.

This is why our team travelled more than 500,000kms over the last 12 months, making sure that RAW was visible in regional, rural and remote communities across Tasmania. 1000's of meaningful conversations have taken place at stockyards, on farms, at the wharf, in shearing sheds, over a "cuppa tea" on the porch, at the local footy club and anywhere else in between.

Building trust and rapport does not happen over night, it takes time and you have to be prepared to get your boots dirty and roll up your sleeves, the RAW team do this well and we love being a genuine part of our local communities.

Prevention is the best medicine and RAW has been actively working on providing people with the practical tools they need to ensure they can be fit and strong, mentally and physically. So that they are ready to take on life's challenges.

Our fresh new approach has been well received and we are inundated with individuals, businesses, sporting clubs and industry peak bodies reaching out and inviting us to be part of transforming their culture and improving mental health and wellbeing within their sphere.

Our programs are evidence based and strategically designed to ensure RAW provides individually tailored and practical support that provides a holistic and strength based approach to improving mental health and wellbeing.

"Boots on the Ground" is a partnership initiative between RAW, Rotary Care Tasmania and Tas Women in Ag that we are proud to be a part of. Boots on the Ground has funded several projects that will benefit rural communities across the state, in addition to the "Are you bogged" talks earlier in the year.

Rural Alive & Well operates four major programs to underpin the organisations mission:

Building healthy and resilient rural communities

RAW Programs are built around imbedding practical skills and providing tools that can be easily used by everyone to be fitter and stronger, both mentally and physically,

Our approach to client engagement is 'non-clinical in style and presents as caring, confidential, non-intrusive, and available when and where the help is most needed.

The **RAW Country** team focus on person-centred engagement and take the time needed to connect with people, providing ongoing practical support and/or referral to key services.

Our team also work with communities across regional and rural Tasmania to initiate and facilitate much-needed community wellbeing programs and activities that increase connectivity and reduce social isolation.

**RAW Connect** is a non-crisis phone support service to help break down the barriers and keep individuals connected.

This service assists individuals to navigate through the complex maze of specialist and clinical support services available. The RAW Connect team are able to ensure that every caller has access to right support at the right time.

**RAW Industry** provides tailored support programs for peak industry bodies and organisations to help build healthy and resilient communities.

RAW Industry encourages industry leaders to make a commitment to start taking action in their workplaces in the health & well-being space.

Specific programs include; Stay Afloat (Seafood Industry), Cutting Through (Timber Industry) and Beyond the Sidelines (Sport)

**RAW Workplace** delivers tailored programs which will change culture and improve the productivity of your workplace. These programs include accredited mental health training, a range of other training and peer support options that will improve mental health and wellbeing in the workplace.

# TREASURER'S REPORT The financial return to profit

The financial reports of the organisation show a welcome return to profitability.

Our surplus for the year was \$210,093, including the \$50,000 cash bonus from the government in response the pandemic.

Total revenue generated by RAW rose \$379,394 with most of this flowing from higher DHHS funding and the Fishing Industry Stay Afloat program funding provided by DPIWE.

It is pleasing to note that RAW Workplace training revenue continues to grow to represent an important RAW program. RAW Workplace is the social enterprise component of RAW and the training and support packages available range from large industry clients to training provided to individual family farming businesses.

The expenses of operating RAW rose by \$88,592. This outstanding effort reflects better control of costs across the organisation, with a particular note of the rise of employee costs of just 6%.

In light of the new programs being delivered across the State, the way RAW's Operational leadership are conducting financial control is outstanding. Costs have only risen this year by 11% overall.

To ensure continued organisational sustainability, our budgeting each year from now will be aimed at producing a surplus of at least 5% of revenue generated.

Our Financial Statements show a strong position with total cash resources of almost \$230,000 at year-end, of which just \$111,000 represents funding for programs yet to be delivered.

Most of RAW's other liabilities reflect employee provisions of different types and loans used to acquire our vehicles.

The finances of RAW are in good shape and getting stronger.

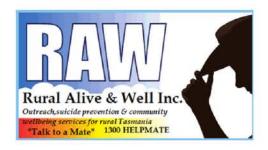


## BRAND
